My Japanese language skills are still good enough for me to come up with "U.S. stock prices fell in reaction to the retirement announcement by Microsoft's Bill Gates."

You can also enter a URL into Babelfish for translation of an entire web page.

Google also offers online translations from its Language Tools page.
